GENERAL SAFETY TIPS

- Always carry this emergency preparedness pocket guide with you
- Pre-program emergency and non-emergency numbers into your mobile phone
- Sign up for Saint Mary's emergency notification system (text and other alerts)
- Read classroom information signs
- Know your location, locate nearest exits
- Be aware of your surroundings
- If you see something, say something
- Report suspicious activities or items
- Double check your course location before arriving on campus
- Adhere to parking guidelines or instructions from security staff

Fire

- Know your location and nearest exits
- In the event of a fire, pull the fire alarm
- Evacuate the building
- a. Assist others in exiting the building
- **b.** Do not use elevators
- c. Stay near the floor
- Do not return to an evacuated building until you are told to do so by an appropriate official

Hazardous Weather including Tornado

- Take shelter, move away from outside rooms and go to the lowest level possible, and stay in a center hallway
- If caught outside, lay flat in the nearest ditch, ravine, or culvert with your hands and arms shielding your head

Active Shooter

- Have an escape route and plan in mind
- Leave your belongings behind
- Keep your hands visible
- Follow the instructions of any law enforcement officers

Hide

- Hide in an area out of the shooter's view
- Block entry to your hiding place and lock the doors
- Silence your mobile phone and/or pager

Fight

- As a last resort and only when your life is in imminent danger:
- Attempt to incapacitate the shooter
- Act with physical aggression and throw items at the active shooter

At Saint Mary's University of Minnesota, we value the safety of each member of our community. This document has been developed with you in mind. While the intent is to be comprehensive, additional personal safety precautions (to be determined by you, the individual) are recommended.

At Saint Mary's, a university safety and security committee is in place to review and discuss safety and security policies and update, engage in training, and implement the university's Emergency Response Plan. In addition, the committee works to mitigate crime and security risks on campus and conducts periodic threat assessments and emergency drills.

Saint Mary's University contracts its security services with GardaWorld Security Services. The security staff is available to provide non-emergency escorts from buildings to vehicles. The security staff is available by radio, located at each building's main entry reception desk, by calling **612-720-0417**, or by pressing the pre-programmed security button from any campus phone.

Guards will wear yellow safety vests during their shifts. This helps identify the guards to students, faculty and staff, and would-be criminals, especially when it is dark. One guard, if not more, will be posted visibly at the entrance of the LSH and BLH lots when classes are in session. If there are no evening classes in BLH, the building will be

locked. Guards are required to communicate via radio when staff, faculty, or students are traveling between buildings. Guards carry flashlights so in the event there is a suspicious vehicle or person, they can use the flashlights to let them know they are watching.

NOTIFICATION SYSTEMS

Blackboard Connect

The university's emergency communication system is the primary means of emergency notification. All students, faculty, and staff are encouraged to sign up for text and voicemail alerts to receive notifications regarding emergencies at the university. This system is intended for immediate transmission of specific information regarding an emergency to all areas of the university, including campus closure due to severe weather.

Through this notification system, information may be sent via voice messages to provided home, work, and mobile phone numbers; emails to email addresses; text messages to mobile phone, PDA, and other text-based devices; and TTY/TDD receiving devices for the hearing impaired. Voice messages and emails are not optional and will be delivered to the contact information you provide. To receive text messages, you must register your mobile phone.

To ensure Saint Mary's University of Minnesota has the most up-to-date contact information, please verify and update your emergency contact information in the Student Portal or the Faculty and Staff Portal.

The Minneapolis Campus Public Address (PA) System
All classrooms are equipped with telephones. In the event
of an emergency, the phone system will be used to send a
page message to all office and classroom phones.

SEVERE WEATHER-RELATED CLOSING Minneapolis Campus

Weather alerts are posted on the Saint Mary's website homepage (smumn.edu) and on Saint Mary's Facebook page. Students attending classes on the Minneapolis Campus may also dial the general number, 612-728-5100, and listen to the answering system's broadcast message which is updated to communicate weather-related cancellation information after an official decision has been made.
